This course of study complements the Adrian College's Ribbons of Excellence (<http://adrian.edu/academics/ribbons-of-excellence/>) and is designed to introduce and cultivate research-based best practices in instructional and assessment strategies and methods. Completion of this program may position graduates for advancement in school districts leading to higher pay. In addition, this degree may ensure job security.
